# TOGETHER WE DID THE IMPOSSIBLE

### Dear Friends.

2022 was an exciting and inspiring year as we celebrated 35 years of saving and healing lives through organ, eye and tissue donation for transplantation and research throughout northern California and northern Nevada. Since our founding in 1987, Donor Network West (formerly California Transplant Donor Network – CTDN) has facilitated the recovery of organs for more than 37,000 transplants, the fourth highest contributing individual organ procurement organization in the United States. Now 35 years later, Donor Network West has grown to become a leading and one of the largest organ procurement organizations in the United States with more than 300 employees, serving more than 13 million people across northern California and northern Nevada.

This year, Donor Network West had a record-breaking year as an organization. Our teams helped coordinate the recovery of 415 organ donors, resulting in 1,260 organs transplanted, the most organs recovered and transplant in Donor Network West's history. We also more than doubled the number of research samples, recovering 6,077, also an organizational record. In addition, Donor Network West coordinated the recovery of tissue from 2,051 donors.

As we continue to look towards the future to ensure our ability to save and heal more lives, Donor Network West opened a new northern Nevada headquarters in Reno, Nevada to expand our organ, eye and tissue donation services and outreach and education in the northern Nevada community. The new 17,000-square-foot facility, conveniently located near hospitals and many of our hospital partners, will allow our team members to collaborate with volunteers and community partners, host educational trainings and further the organization's mission to save and heal more lives through donation.

I am so proud to be a part of an organization that saves and heals lives every day and I want to thank all the donors and their families for giving the greatest gift – the gift of life. The lifesaving work we do every day for the past 35 years would not have been possible without the tireless commitment, passion and hard work of our employees past and present.

I also recognize that the organ donation process is supported by numerous partners, including our hospitals, doctors, nurses, funeral homes, coroners, medical examiners, and various other healthcare professionals whom we are honored to work alongside. I applaud everyone who has been a part of the lifesaving work of Donor Network West and look forward to continuing to partner with each of you as we work to save and heal more lives for years to come.

Thank you again to all of you for everything you do to help raise awareness about organ, eye and tissue donation. Please continue to share your stories and share your wishes with your loved ones. Together we can one day eliminate the organ transplant waiting list.

### WAITING FOR A KIDNEY TRANSPLANT

Deanna and Fabian became first time parents to twin girls Nya and Amaya on July 29, 2019. Their exciting journey would quickly become an uphill battle. Shortly after birth, doctors discovered Nya's kidneys were not fully developed and urged the new parents to be patient as baby Nya was still growing. After a few weeks, doctors became certain her kidneys were not going to fully function on their own.

Suddenly, Deanna and Fabian were thrown into a world full of feeding tubes, growth hormones, monthly hospital stays and so much more. With one "healthy" daughter and one medically fragile child, they are reminded daily what Nya's life would be like with healthy kidneys. At nearly two years old, Nya has never enjoyed food without the help of her gastro-jejunal (GJ) feeding tube. Since birth, Nya has spent almost two weeks every month in the hospital. The Martinez family has exhausted all of their available options. Fabian is unfortunately not a match for his daughter but is ready and willing to donate his kidney and become part of a donation chain. Deanna is a match, but is not able to donate to her daughter due to underlying health issues.

This hopeful family is turning to their community to find a match for their little girl. As parents their hopes and dreams for Nya are to live a happy, healthy life with her sister Amaya. Nya's story is one of resilience and strength. Our work directly impacts our efforts in one day eliminating the national transplant waitlist so that children like Nya, never have to wait for their second chance at a full life.

## JEHUDIEL MENDOZA MORENO KIDNEY RECIPIENT

Native Nevadan Jehudiel Mendoza Moreno began experiencing health issues at just two years old. He battled a severe bacterial infection, underwent years of dialysis treatments, was put into a medically-induced coma and had fingers and part of his foot amputated. He was among the over 1,900 children in the U.S waiting for a second chance at life. Fortunately, Jehudiel was able to receive a kidney transplant at Lucile Packard Children's Hospital Stanford in December 2020. He is now a rambunctious 8-year-old and was recently selected as an honoree to be featured as part of the Donor Network West and Reno Aces partnership. Jehudiel had the opportunity to throw the first pitch and run the bases at the Greater Nevada Field in Reno. Nevada.

## New Northern Nevada Headquarters

In support of our efforts to expand our outreach, education and donation services in the northern Nevada community, Donor Network West opened a new northern Nevada headquarters in Reno, Nevada. Donor Network West will use the larger, enhanced facility for team members to collaborate with volunteers and community partners, host educational trainings and further the organization's mission to save and heal more lives through donation.

Located at 5440 Reno Corporate Drive in Reno, Donor Network West's northern Nevada headquarters is 17,000-square-feet and located near hospitals and healthcare partners.

### TISSUE DONATION

In 2022, the Tissue Operations team continued to improve and heal more lives than ever before. Our compassionate and knowledgeable Donation Coordinators fielded over 40,000 donor referrals and spoke with more than 5,000 families about the opportunity to donate, providing hope and solace to those in immense grief.

Additionally, the Tissue Recovery team was recognized with several outstanding service awards for the quality of their surgical recovery of lifesaving tissues, resulting in near 0 surgical errors and more lives impacted.

This was also a record year for the organization in the number of heart valve and vascular tissues recovered, saving the lives of pediatric patients and other recipients in desperate need. We are looking forward to seeing even more success in 2023 with more lives impacted through the miracle of eye and tissue donation and transplantation.

## VICTOR SALAZAR CORNEA & KIDNEY RECIPIENT

Victor Salazar's health battles began at just 10 years old when he was diagnosed with keratoconus—an eye disease that affects the cornea and can result in vision blurring or loss. During his college years, Victor's vision worsened drastically. He also began experiencing unrelated health issues due to an under-developed kidney. Fortunately, he received two life-changing cornea transplants and a kidney transplant between 2014 and 2015.

Currently, 90,000 people in the U.S. are on the national transplant wait list for a kidney. Thanks to organ, eye and tissue donation, Victor is now able to thrive and flourish in his own life. He enjoys archery, exploring the outdoors in off-road vehicles and spending time with his husband and family.

## ORGAN, EYE AND TISSUE DONATION FOR RESEARCH SUPPORTS NEW THERAPIES FOR COVID-19 AND BEYOND

The COVID-19 pandemic has taken both a human and economic toll on the world around us. In an effort to save lives, the biomedical research field worked tirelessly to process the identification of the COVID-19 virus and developed a successful vaccine in record time, the fastest in human history. While RNA vaccines have not been used previously, they are the result of decades of prior research. In fact, the RNA molecule was first identified in the early 1900s. It has taken almost a century to successfully use it for therapeutic purposes in humans.

As the rollout of the COVID-19 vaccines continue to be distributed around the world, it is a reminder of the important role that Donor Network West's research department plays in supporting biomedical research. Through our work in recovering organs, eyes and tissue for research, Donor Network West has been able to support a large number of world-class projects across the United States, ranging from finding new therapies for COVID-19 to treating leukemia in children and building the first artificial retina for blind people.



## **RESEARCH**

Donor Network West provided 6,077 research samples to scientists in the US, including 428 research organs. This is the most research samples and organs that we have ever recovered as an organization. There is no doubt the gifts provided by our authorized donors will be the cornerstone for new treatments for various diseases and will save lives for years to come.

### Northern Nevada Advisory Council

In 2022, Donor Network West launched the Northern Nevada Advisory Council. The Council, co-chaired by the city of Reno Mayor, Hillary Schieve, and Janice Whaley, President and CEO of Donor Network West, is made up of leading community leaders and healthcare professionals from throughout northern Nevada to champion the cause of organ and tissue donation in the community to help heal and save more lives.

The council will lead outreach efforts in their communities – with a special focus on underrepresented communities – to create and improve opportunities for people to better understand, embrace and consider registering to be a donor. These council members will be instrumental in advising Donor Network West in identifying new opportunities to promote its mission throughout northern Nevada and provide guidance through challenges or barriers around transplantation.

### Second Chance Program with the Washoe County Deputy Sheriffs Department

Donor Network West partnered with the Washoe County Deputy Sheriffs to host the Second Chances program. Washoe County Deputy Sheriffs at their discretion, gave registered organ donors who are pulled over for minor traffic violations a warning ticket, as opposed to a fine. The program is designed to help encourage more Washoe County residents to register as organ donors. Drivers who have the official organ donor heart on their up-to-date Nevada driver's license may be told that they are being given a second chance – because their status as an organ donor gives a fellow citizen a second chance at life. Those who do not have the donor designation on their driver's license may still be issued a second chance warning ticket for considering registering as a donor in the future.

## **FUNDRAISING**

### Spare A Life Bowling Fundraiser

Donor Network West hosted its first fundraiser in northern Nevada, Spare A Life, at the National Bowling Stadium on May 19. Attendees at the family-friendly fundraising event bowled and participated in a silent auction in support of organ, eye and tissue donation. All funds went to Donor Network West to help raise awareness about organ donation and inspire the northern Nevada community to register as organ donors. The event was supported by several local businesses including Dolan Auto Group, Renown Health, Dickson Commercial Group, Plumas Bank, KPS3 and Carson Tahoe Health, and the Reno + Sparks Chamber of Commerce.

### Donate Life Run/Walk

This year we hosted the first in-person Donate Life Run/Walk since the beginning of the pandemic. Now in its 12th year, the Donate Life Run/Walk is a 5K, 10K and Kids Dash fundraising event hosted every September, the first Saturday after Labor Day. The event brings donor families, transplant recipients and those waiting for a lifesaving transplant together to raise awareness about organ, eye and tissue donation for transplantation and inspire others to say "yes" to donation. With the support of our communities and the generosity of our sponsors, we raised over \$96,000, directly impacting our mission to save and heal as many lives as possible.

### Legacy Ball

In celebration of our 35th anniversary, Donor Network West hosted its first Legacy Ball benefit. The special evening took place in September at the Palace Hotel in San Francisco, to raise awareness and critical funding to support community outreach and education efforts to inspire more people to register to become organ donors. We are proud to share that we raised \$22,000 to sustain our comfort blanket program through 2023!





## HOSPITAL PERFORMANCE DATA

Donor Network West continued its life-saving mission, recovering a record number of organs for transplant from 415 organ donors. In addition, 2,051 people said "yes" to tissue donation. Through the generosity of these donors and their families, partner hospitals, coroners, and funeral homes, thousands of lives were saved and improved.
